# Today's Program

A proud uncle, Dick Hoppin, introduced his nephew **Major Chris Hoppin**, **USAF** as today's guest speaker. Chris grew up in Woodland attending Zamora School and Woodland High School. A 2002 graduate of the United States Air Force Academy with a BS degree in Management, Chris did his undergraduate pilot training at Columbus AFB in Mississippi. Among his seven operational deployments are tours of duty in McConnell AFB in Kansas as well as Ramstein AB in Germany. Since April 2009 he has been serving as C-17A instructor aircraft commander and chief of the commander's action group, 21<sup>st</sup> Airlift Squadron at Travis AFB. He holds a Command Pilot rating with more than 3500 flight hours in various Air Force aircraft including the C-17A Globemaster, C-21A Lear 35, KC-135R, KC-135T Stratotanker, T-1B, and T-37B. Among many distinctions Chris is a Distinguished Graduate of Squadron Officer School at Maxwell AFB; has earned three Air Medals, three Aerial

Achievement Medals, the Air Force Commendation Medal and the Air Force Achievement Medal; and holds a Master degree in International Business from Trident University.

Chris said he got interested in the Air Force and in flying from family friend Dan Dougherty, himself a former Air Force pilot. Chris said the events of 9/11 happened while he was at the Air Force Academy, and they moved him to focus on leadership development. While he spoke, Chris presented us with a display of pictures of the various aircraft he has worked with.



Chris outlined the various deployments in his career, both domestically and in Europe. He explained his various roles, such as in mid-air refueling and the transport of equipment and personnel. He described the capacities and capabilities of the aircraft he has flown, as well as some of the special assignments he's taken. One emotional trip occurred last Christmas when his flight was assigned to return the remains of a fallen United States pilot lost in Afghanistan, to the pilot's family in Hawaii.

Major Hoppin says he is responsible for providing 10 years of service to the USAF following his graduation from flight school. That period ends next year when he hopes to bring a little more continuity and stability to his life.

Chris ended his program by responding to many questions, and thanking the Club for its support of the men & women in our country's services. He appreciated carrying on the legacy of service many before him had started.
