Today's Program

Jim Nolan introduced the program for the day, our own Dr. Christian Sherrill, D.C., Q.M.E.





Christian was born in San Leandro, grew up in Cupertino, and graduated with honors from the University of California, Santa Barbara with a degree in Behavioral Neuroscience. He then went on to Palmer Chiropractic West in San Jose where, after four years of study and clinical rotations, he earned his Doctor of Chiropractic

degree. While at Palmer, he met his now wife, Holidae Barrow, from Woodland, who is also a Chiropractor. In 2003 they opened Premier Chiropractic and in 2004 Christian joined the Woodland Rotary Club. In 2006 they opened the Pilates Studio and became Premier Chiropractic & Pilates. Holidae and Christian have two sons, Luke, age 7, and Cohen, age 4.

Christian spoke to us about his mission to improve the Quality of Life for his patients (and keep **George Berrettoni** awake for the next 30 minutes). Health care is rapidly changing and the change is accelerating year by year. Christian's goals are to help you feel better and help your

employees feel better which saves your business money by having fewer medical problems and absences.

According to a Global Burden of Disease study (funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation), back pain is the number one cause of 'years lived with disability' ("YLDs") worldwide; neck pain is also a common contributor to years lived with disability. Musculoskeletal disorders ranged from 9.6% of YLDs to 28.9% of YLDs and lower back pain was the leading cause of YLDs in 86 countries and the second or third leading cause in 67 countries.

Christian emphasized our good and bad habits related to our musculoskeletal system. For instance, bad posture, or as he called it, Upper Cross Syndrome. This is standing with your hips and head forward and your back arched. This type of posture can lead to headaches, pinched nerves, neck pain, numbress in your arms and other symptoms. His practice endeavors to correct those bad habits with adjustments, stretching, exercising, and laser treatments.

Their practice also has about 25% of their space devoted to Pilates. He is an advocate of the Pilates regimen because they can isolate muscle groups for stretching and strength training to improve your overall health, lessen your years lived with disability and therefore improve your overall outlook on life.
