

Today's Meeting





Today's Program



Nan Su, senior reporter for the Epoch Times newspaper spoke to us about Chinese expansion. The Epoch Times was

founded by Chinese Americans to print the "truth", especially about Communist



China. On April 8-10, 2023, China completely surrounded the island of Taiwan with military exercises designed to intimidate Taiwan and provoke the United States as well as Japan and other East Asian countries. Taiwan is important to China as a main piece of the puzzle to control the South China Sea. Nationalist goals are really secondary to this objective of control.








China has created man made islands in the southern part of the South China Sea by building concrete land masses on coral reefs. This gives them the pretext of claiming the waters surrounding these so called islands. They have constructed military bases on these islands. Gaining control of Taiwan gives them total control of the entire South China Sea and enables them to cut off Japan from its major supply routes. With total domination of the South China Sea, China will have dominion over 40% of the world's trade.

Total control over the South China Sea will give China significant influence over all of Southeast Asia, and further their goal of controlling South Asia. It also is a key step in what Nan says is China's ultimate goal of control over the world. They are allied with all our chief enemies, Russia, Iran and North Korea. All of the "Stan" countries between Russia, Iran and China are loosely under China's influence. Nan asked who is our most dangerous rival, Russia or China? Russia has only 1/10th of the GDP of China, and thus is not our most dangerous rival.

The Southeast Pacific has $\frac{1}{2}$ of the world's population and 2/3rds of world trade (both of which includes China). China is expanding its military. It already has more navy ships than we do. Other Asian countries are expanding their military also, including Japan, which increased its defense spending 26.3% this year over 2022 and if five years will double its 2022 defense spending.

Nan's message was clear, China is dangerous and our most dangerous rival. It is a brutal dictatorship. After the Communist takeover, the government has killed 80 million of its own citizens. The so called monster China has become was fueled by direct U.S. investment. In 2021 the U.S. directly invested 118.2 billion dollars in China. The one thing Nan could not answer clearly is exactly what kind of control is China seeking. Is it economic superiority and influence, or is it actual ruling of other countries and the destruction of our country?
